

## **ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS**

McKinley County and its working partner, the Northwest New Mexico Council of Governments, would like to acknowledge the effort and coordination to continue water discussions and priorities in the County's annual rural water summit. Providing such crucial information to our regional communities is not only important but timely, with the anticipation of the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP), funding provided by the Bipartisan Infrastructure law, and global climate change impacts. Small water systems have struggled for decades to get the support and funding needed to get local capital infrastructure projects off the shelves.

This summit also provides an opportunity for small water systems to start planning, or projecteering, to determine feasible steps and avenues to be eligible for potential funding programs. 



#### **Water Planning in New Mexico**

New Mexico has 16 water planning regions, each with its own water plan. New Mexico also has a State Water Plan. The regional and state water plans are vital tools intended to guide water management in the state to best meet all the state's water users — now and into the future. Strategic water planning is best informed by accurate and reliable data and engaged citizens, which leads to better implementation.

The Regional Water Planning Statute (§72-14-44 NMSA 1978) outlines (a) a general criteria for developing regional water plans and (b) the established powers and duties for implementing regional water planning.

#### 50-Year Water Plan

The draft 50-Year Water Plan compiles findings from scientific papers reports, guidance from planning and agency partners, and input from a wide array of stakeholders to describe and plan for climate change impacts to water supplies in New Mexico over the next



50 years. The draft 50-Year Water Plan assesses increasing aridity, outlines expected changes and likely vulnerabilities, and identifies recommendations for policy makers, stakeholders, and agency partners.

The Lower Rio Grande Public Water Works Authority currently consists of eleven water systems in four separate areas providing service to fifteen Colonias communities in the area south of Las Cruces from Brazito to north end of Anthony, Butterfield Park & Organ on the East Mesa, and Valle Del Rio and High Valley. The LRGPWWA service area is about 100 square miles, and it provides water service to just over 5,000 connections.




