### Monthly Report – February, 2020

- A. Local Government Transportation Project Fund: The State of New Mexico recently initiated a new LGTPF fund to support transportation needs across New Mexico, complimenting the ongoing Local Govt. Road Fund. This fund provides \$50 million statewide and is not restrained by federal functional classification requirements. In 2019 a total of 22 projects were submitted from the NWRTPO, (along with 2 from the SWRTPO and 4 from the MRRTPO) totaling 28 projects for the DOT Dist. 6 region. The NWRTPO region was awarded just over \$12 million 2 to 3 times the funding the RTIPR provides to our region annually. Eleven member governments of the NWRTPO and Farmington MPO were funded for 14 projects which are now underway. Presently funding for LGTPF projects is not anticipated until FFY2021; nonetheless, the NWRTPO will program and prioritize current (remaining / unfunded from FFY2019) and any new LGTPF projects within the FFY2020 biennial RTIPR.
- B. GIS Data Gathering, Mapping and Compiling Work: COG staff Carrie House continues to provide technical assistance and GIS mapping for development of 66 new miles of recreational trails in the Zuni Mountains in McKinley and Cibola Counties during FFY18 FFY21; and continues contributing GIS mapping for regional transportation infrastructure. RTPO staff need to follow up with our three Pueblos Laguna, Acoma and Zuni regarding the opportunity to include their transportation mapping and data into our regional portfolio, based on what each Pueblo is willing to share. The NWCOG was the only New Mexico recipient of a NADO Impact Award for the ongoing development of recreational trails in the Zuni Mountains of McKinley and Cibola Counties.
- C. <u>NWRTPO Regional Transportation Plan</u>: RTPO staff have conducted annual updates to our R.T.P. at this time, and anticipate more updates in the year ahead, as the NMDOT (State plan) has come into the 4-year major update cycle. Our RTPO may not need major updates to our plan, as we update it on an annual basis.
- D. Scenic Byway Funding is back: President Trump signed the "Reviving America's Scenic Byways Act of 2019" into law reestablishing the Scenic Byway Program but presently without funding. Nonetheless this provides the NWRTPO the opportunity to undertake a demanding process to pursue national designation for parts of our New Mexico byway portion. RTPO members are encouraged to spread the news, as a N.M. TOA Byway Oversight Council builds an application to designate portions of our TOA byway corridor as a national (as opposed to state) scenic byway. Historically across the nation regions who achieved national scenic byway status have enjoyed a major and positive impact on tourism and resulting economic growth for the region the national corridor serves. The TOA Byway Council will have to document and build guidance within the application concerning services, amenities, regional support and especially "intrinsic value" attractions that characterize our region and history along the proposed national corridor – for our visitors to enjoy.

#### U.S. DOT Announces Initiative to Prevent Human Trafficking

The United States Department of Transportation (U.S.DOT) <u>Transportation Leaders Against Human Trafficking</u> <u>Initiative</u> is a collaborative effort between transportation and travel industry stakeholders working to prevent human trafficking in transportation systems. The U.S.DOT's Advisory Committee on Human Trafficking published a <u>report</u> in 2019 outlining Federal actions and best practices for States and local transportation stakeholders. Chao recently <u>announced</u> \$5.4 million in grant awards as part of the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) <u>Human Trafficking</u> <u>Awareness and Public Safety Initiative</u>. U.S. DOT Releases Complete Trip – ITS4US Deployment Program Fact Sheet

The United States Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT) published a <u>fact sheet</u> for the Complete Trip – ITS4US Deployment Program. The fact sheet outlines the Complete Trip concept along with the program's vision and goals. Individuals are encouraged to participate in the seven part <u>webinar series</u>, which will offer useful information on deployment partnerships and planning, deployment scenario examples, the procurement path, and more.

# U.S. DOT Publishes Guiding Principles for Automated Vehicle Technologies 4.0

The United States Department of Transportation published a report titled Ensuring American Leadership in Automated Vehicle Technologies: Automated Vehicles (AV) 4.0. The report establishes Federal principles for the development and integration of automated vehicles in the national transportation system, consisting of three focus areas: safety and security, innovation, and a consistent regulatory approach. The report also highlights collaborative efforts across Federal departments, independent agencies, and commissions to provide high-level guidance to State and local governments and all stakeholders on the U.S. government's approach to AVs.

#### 13 Cities to Join Smart Cities Collaborative

Transportation for America announced 13 communities and municipal agencies that are participating in the 2020 <u>Smart Cities</u> <u>Collaborative</u> program. The year-long program provides public sector transportation leaders with the opportunity to engage with each other and collaborate on new mobility technologies and best practices that enhance quality of life. Over the course of the year, participants will work together to develop and implement pilot projects in curbside management and learn about managing new mobility services.

# Recently Published Report on the Future of the Last-Mile Delivery Ecosystem

The *World Economic Forum* published a <u>report</u> discussing the increased demand for e-commerce delivery and its implications on traffic congestion and delivery costs. It also includes 24 interventions for the public and private sectors to help mitigate and reduce these challenges by improving strategic planning to better manage traffic volume.



#### New Evaluation Report on E-Scooter Pilot Program Impacts

The *City of Chicago* published an <u>evaluation</u> of Chicago's electric scooter (e-scooter) pilot program and its impacts on the local transportation system. The evaluation report includes utilization data to assess the performance of the pilot and highlights community outreach efforts that helped to educate the public about the program. It also describes the lessons learned and outlines policy recommendations for future e-scooter programs.

#### New Survey on Transportation Priorities for U.S. Cities

The Boston University Initiative on Cities published a <u>report</u> identifying key issues and priorities facing U.S. mayors. The report highlights infrastructure as the highest priority, particularly related to improving roadways, mass transit, and safety improvements for bicycles and pedestrians. The report also examines the positive impacts of <u>Opportunity Zones</u> in boosting local economies.



# U.S. DOT Announces \$8.9 Million to Improve Safety on Tribal Lands

The United States Department of Transportation (U.S.

*DOT*) Secretary Elaine L. Chao recently <u>announced</u> \$8.9 million in grant awards to 80 Federally recognized American Indian Tribal Nations for traffic safety improvements. The grant funding will support 91 projects aimed to improve road safety and accessibility including sidewalk and road repairs, and the development or update of transportation safety plans. Funded through the Federal Highway Administration <u>Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund</u>, the initiative will help enhance safety and quality of life for Tribal communities.

The *City of Columbus, Ohio* recently became the first city in the country to launch autonomous shuttle service in a residential area. The shuttle service, which is free for residents, connects community members to jobs, education, food resources, transit connections, and other amenities in order to improve guality of life.

U.S. DOT Announces Availability of \$1 Billion for BUILD Grant Funding

The United States Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT) Secretary Elaine L. Chao recently <u>announced</u> \$1 billion in available grant funding as part of the <u>Better Utilizing Investments to</u> <u>Leverage Development (BUILD) Transportation Discretionary</u> <u>Grants program</u>. The grant funding will support planning and capital investment projects that improve surface transportation infrastructure such as roads, bridges, multimodal connections, and more. The Fiscal Year 2020 BUILD program plans to award 50 percent of grant funds to projects located in rural communities, aligning with the Department's <u>Rural Opportunities to Use</u> <u>Transportation for Economic Success initiative</u>. The <u>Notice cf</u> <u>Funding Opportunity</u> application period will remain open until May 18, 2020.

# New Research Examines Interaction Between Bikeshare Systems and Public Transit

#### New Report Analyzes Micromobility Safety

The *International Transport Forum* recently published a <u>report</u> analyzing the safety of electric scooters (e-scooters) and other forms of micromobility. The report examines the road safety risks associated with e-scooters, skateboards, and skates as compared to bicyclists and motorists. The report found that escooters and bicycles are similarly safe, highlighting the importance of improved regulations to better support micromobility. Researchers found that "a trip by car or by motorcycle in a dense urbar, area is more likely to result in a traffic fatality than a trip by micro-vehicle," a category that includes both traditional and powered bicycles, scooters, skates, and skateboards.

### San Francisco, California Begins Pilot Requiring Permittees to Add Accessible Electric Scooter Models for People With Disabilities

San Francisco, California is currently piloting a new requirement for the companies permitted to operate electric scooter (e-scooter) fleets to include models for people with disabilities. The city instructed the companies to develop devices with input from the disabilities community rather than requiring specific types of devices. Through the adaptive scooter pilot program, a total of 50 adaptive scooters, which range in device type and size, are available to the public. The city's goal is to make e-scooters more accessible and inclusive to riders who have not previously had access to shared e-scooter programs. The lessons learned from this pilot will help inform the city's future regulations.



#### New Research Examines Walking and Bicycling Trends

A <u>recent study</u> published in the *Journal of Transport & Health* examined walking and bicycling trends across the country between 2001 and 2017. Based on data from the <u>2017 National Household</u> <u>Travel Survey</u>, researchers found that national rates of daily walking slightly increased while bicycling rates remained consistent. The research also highlights the impact that demographic, socioeconomic, and spatial variations have on active travel rates.

#### Research Highlights Social Equity Implications of Congestion Management Strategies

The *Transportation Sustainability Research Center* at the *University* of *California, Berkeley* <u>released a report</u> on the social equity impacts of congestion management strategies. It discusses a range of strategies related to pricing, parking and curb policies, operations, infrastructure, transportation service, and taxation. The report includes a comprehensive list of 30 congestion management strategies and examines whether they help reduce social equity barriers or create additional challenges.

#### New Research Analyzes Transportation Impacts Using Vehicle Miles Traveled Rather than Level of Service

The National Center for Sustainable Transportation at the University of California, Davis released a policy brief on transportation impact assessments using vehicle miles traveled (VMT). The brief highlights the differences between using VMT and Level of Service (LOS) metrics to assess the transportation impacts of land use development projects. Researchers analyzed 153 projects in Los Angeles between 2001 and 2016 to determine how using VMT rather than LOS could affect transportation impact assessments for urban development. They found that using VMT could streamline the permitting process, help reduce delays and costs for housing development, and incentivize infill development.

Public entities are expected to provide check, money order or purchase order in order to purchase items at the annual public entity sale.



To better address the needs of rural America, which has historically been neglected, DOT intends to award 50% of BUILD Transportation grant funding to projects located in rural areas that deliver positive benefits for these communities, consistent with the Department's R.O.U.T.E.S. initiative. For this round of BUILD Transportation grants, the maximum grant award is \$25 million, and no more than \$100 million can be awarded to a single State, as specified in the appropriations act.

To provide technical assistance to prospective applicants, DOT is hosting a series of webinars during the FY 2020 BUILD grant application process. A webinar on how to compete for BUILD Transportation Grants for all applicants will be held on February 25, 2020. The deadline to submit an application is May 18, 2020.

The new ROUTES initiative will work to provide rural project sponsors with pertinent and easy-to-use information about the Department's infrastructure programs, to help overcome resource challenges that can be an impediment to competitive applications. The ROUTES Initiative was established by Secretary of Transportation

Elaine L. Chao in DOT Order 5050.1, signed October 28, 2019.

#### **ROUTES** Council

The ROUTES Council will lead the ROUTES Initiative, and coordinate rural-related efforts among the modal administrations. The Council comprises leaders from the Office of the Secretary, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), and Federal Transit Administration (FTA).

#### **Rural Transportation Infrastructure Management Team**

The Rural Transportation Infrastructure Management Team supports the Rural Transportation Infrastructure Council by implementing the priorities established by the Council. This includes sharing DOT rural resources with rural stakeholders and the public, and collecting their input to help improve DOT programs. The Team comprises staff from the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Transportation Policy (OST-P), the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Research and Technology (OST-R), FAA, FHWA, FRA, and FTA.

## Timeframes

The ROUTES Initiative began when Secretary Chao signed the Departmental Order on October 30, 2019.

The ROUTES Council met on November 5th to begin reviewing applicable discretionary grant programs for transportation infrastructure.

Beginning in January, DOT staff will attend stakeholder conferences to hear from rural communities about their transportation infrastructure challenges and needs.

The New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) in partnership with the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish (NMDGF) has begun developing the Wildlife Corridors Action Plan (Plan) in accordance with New Mexico Senate Bill 228, the Wildlife Corridors Act (Act).

The Act, signed into law by New Mexico Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham in 2019, directs the NMDOT and the NMDGF to develop the Plan for NMDOT roads statewide. The Plan will identify wildlife-vehicle collision hotspots that pose a risk to the traveling public, identify wildlife corridors from ecological data, and provide a list of priority projects based on the results of the Plan's analysis. The Plan will provide information on wildlife movement with an emphasis on large mammals such as elk, deer, bear and mountain lion. A team of national experts led by Daniel B. Stephens and Associates (DBS&A), under contract with NMDOT, will develop the Plan in partnership with NMDGF. The DBS&A team will use a science-driven approach to identify areas per the Act that "*pose a risk to successful wildlife migration or that pose a risk to the traveling public*" and will be based on NMDOT crash data and ecological information on wildlife movements.

The Plan will build on past and ongoing efforts and is intended to raise support for and consensus in the identification of priority wildlife corridors and priority projects across New Mexico. Development of the Plan will also involve soliciting input from the general public, tribal governments and interested stakeholders.

We are writing to inform you that this is an opportunity for the public and engaged stakeholders to provide input and support for potential actions that will increase public safety and promote wildlife habitat connectivity.

There will be 8 public meetings to be held around the state to introduce the project and we invite you and your organization to participate. Attached please find the meeting locations, dates and times as well as details on how to submit comments. We look forward to working with the public and engaged stakeholder's as this process continues.
